








Plays written by Marfa students during the Playwriting Workshop will be performed by area actors and staged for the community during a free performance at the Crowley Theater on Tuesday, May 3, 2016.

This staging at the Crowley Theater follows the work's premiere at Salvage Vanguard Theater in Austin, Texas, and performances at Chicago's Rivendell Theatre, Gemini Center in San Antonio, Teatro Paraguas in Santa Fe, the Shelter Theater, San Miguel de Allende, and the Natinoal Hispanic Cultural Center in Albuquerque. Raul Garza reflects his real and imagined world through stories that resound with authenticity and sense of place. His fulllength play Fantasmaville garnered the National Latino Playwriting Award, and earned a B. Iden Payne Award nomination for Outstanding Original Script. His full-length plays Dos Pocitos, Cura, and Confessions of a Mexpatriate have been staged around the country, and in Mexico. His one-act play, My HEB, was selected for Best of Fest staging at Hyde Park Theatre's Frontera Fest 2015. Raul won the 2014 Austin Chronicle Short Story Contest for In the Room, and earned Honorable Mention in the 2014 Texas Observer Short Story Contest for LeBaron. When not writing, Raul teaches Kundalini yoga, fills up on pop culture, and serves as creative director of TKO Advertising. Amen. Namaste. Scene.
